

#### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Community engagement is important to a successful planning effort. The use of public participation makes it possible to have a clearer understanding of how the residents feel regarding different parts of the community, as well as how certain issues are and can impact the community in the future.

However, community engagement worked in a different manner during the Victoria project due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Strides were made to get as much feedback during the process as possible without jeopardizing the health of the committee or residents. Therefore, during most of the Comprehensive Plan portion of the process, meetings were held via Zoom.

#### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Community engagement in Victoria was designed as a component of the project. It was structured in a manner allowing for stakeholders to be involved in numerous ways throughout the process. Some key elements will include:

- Education: Planning 101
- Use of a steering committee
- SurveyMonkey
- Public hearings

#### Planning 101

Planning 101 forms the educational foundation for the entire project. In this process, there was one workshop. This workshop addressed:

- What is a Comprehensive Plan?
- How the plan is used?
- How does the plan impact me?

#### **Steering Committee Meetings**

The Planning Commission served as the steering committee, to provide regular input on all phases of the planning project. This group also provided the internal assistance the planning effort needed to get more people involved in the process.

The steering committee also acts as a sounding board during the entire process; this allows all pieces/Chapters of the plan to be reviewed and commented on at regularly scheduled meetings. The steering committee is one of the more critical components of the process.

#### SurveyMonkey

SurveyMonkey, a web based survey tool was utilized for gathering specific input on Victoria. The survey process allows

individuals to provide input while remaining totally anonymous. The survey was advertised using posters hung up throughout the community.

An strong effort was made to make sure as many people as possible would answer the survey. Therefore, information about the survey and how to complete it on-line was sent to every address in Victoria and the immediately surrounding area. The process used was a United States Postal Service tool called Every Door Direct Mail.

The survey had a total of 107 individuals answering the survey with 92 of these identifying themselves as residents of Victoria. The following is a summary of some questions and their responses:

# Do you live in the corporate limits of Victoria or outside the corporate limits?

Within Victoria92 people (90.2%)Outside Victoria10 people (9.8%)

  Victoria.
- We need to open up some thing off interstate to bring people through our community. We need a restaurant that will stay open longer for gathering after school sports.
- Liberal wind and solar restrictions. Allow chickens in city limits.
- I would like to see Job opportunity's come to Victoria or the Ellis Co area that would get people to stay in the community.

- My vision would be to find a way to make Victoria a small business community with little boutiques/shops downtown. Hays can have the larger chains and we can have a town of small start up businesses with sidewalk events to draw people here.
- No new taxes, No increase in Utilities
- A reworking of Cathedral Avenue from the North edge of town to Fourth Street would be helpful. # What is your vision for Victoria? Share your vision for the short- and long-term improvements that will make our great community better in 2040.


- Make necessary improvements and plan major changes in 5 year spans to show community you are willing to change and adapt.

- Annexed into Hays.



- Lots for sale to build on where duplex or apartments could be built.




- Cost of lots and some codes that prohibit building them in certain locations.

- Turn the old nursing home into apartments or reopen it to create jobs and bring people to Victoria. Nobody wants


- to build in Victoria because it's dying.



- Well the city parks restrooms are locked don't see why we need them the local kids will just beat them up if we leave them open to the public.


- Water fountains would be a welcome addition, the bathrooms could be redone to make them a little more family friendly instead of the single user versions now.

- Dog park.








HOW IMPORTANT WAS SCHOOL LOCATION IN YOUR DECISION TO MOVE TO THE COMMUNITY?

#### **GOALS AND POLICES**

Planning for the future land uses of the community is an ongoing process of goal setting and problem solving aimed at encouraging and enhancing a better community with a better quality of life. Planning focuses upon ways of solving existing problems within the community, and providing a management tool enabling Victoria citizens to achieve their vision for the future.

Visioning is a process of evaluating present conditions, identifying problem areas, and bringing about consensus on how to overcome existing problems and manage change. By determining Victoria's vision, the community can decide where it wants to be in the future, and then develop a "roadmap" guiding decisions of the community. However, the plan cannot only be based upon this "vision" and "road map" concept. The residents of Victoria must also act or implement the necessary steps involved in achieving this "vision".



Change is continuous, therefore Victoria must decide specific criteria that will be used to judge and manage change. Instead of reacting to development pressures after the fact, the community along with their strategic vision, can better reinforce the desired changes, and discourage negative impacts that may

undermine the vision. A shared vision allows Victoria to focus its diverse energies and minimize conflicts in the present, and in the future.



A key component of a Comprehensive Plan is the goals and policies. The issues and concerns of the citizens are developed into a vision. The vision statement can then be further delineated and translated into action statements and/or policies, used to guide, direct, and base decisions for future growth, development and change within Victoria. Consensus on "what is good land use?" and "how to manage change in order to provide the greatest benefit to the community and its residents?" is formed. Victoria's goals and policies attempt to address various issues, regarding the questions of "how" to plan for the future.

Goals are desires, necessities and issues to be attained in the future. A goal should be established in a manner that allows it to be accomplished. Goals are the end-state of a desired outcome. Goals also play a factor in the establishment of policies within a community. In order to attain certain goals and/or policies within City government, they may need to be modified or changed from time to time.

**Policies** are measurable, definable steps that lead to the eventual completion of the goal. They are specific statements of principle or actions that



imply a direction that needs to be undertaken. These policies will synthesize the information from the goals, as well as the responses from the participants of the various input processes. Policies play an important role in the Comprehensive Development Plan because they direct the different actions that will need to be taken to meet the goals.

It is important for counties to establish their goals and policies in a manner allowing for both longterm and short-term accomplishments. The shortterm goals and policies serve several functions:

- Allow for immediate feedback and success, which fuels the desire to achieve additional goals and better policies.
- Allow for the distribution of resources over time thus assuring a balanced use of public investment.
- Establish certain policies that need to be followed before the long-term goals can be accomplished.

#### VICTORIA VISION AND THE PLAN

The Victoria Comprehensive Plan provides a broadly painted picture for the future. The vision statements and goals describing the desired future conditions provide guidance for land use decisions and other actions, both public and private that collectively will determine the future of Victoria.

The core premise embedded in the Victoria Plan 2020 Vision is designed to maintain and enhance the health, safety and welfare of the City during times of change, to promote our ideals and values as changes occur, and to meet the needs of today without sacrificing the ability of future generations to meet their needs. The plan acknowledges the importance of the connections between economic, environmental,

and social components of the community. The plan is a combination of practicality and vision, and provides guidelines for sustaining the rich fabric of Victoria.

#### VICTORIA PLAN GOALS AND POLICIES

The goals and policies for the Victoria Comprehensive Plan should be developed by the community based upon the information within this Plan.

Goals are intended as a long-range desire; however, as the Plan is implemented and different things in the world around Victoria changes, then the goals need to be modified to address the new direction and factors. Therefore, goals need to be flexible to ensure success and positive outcomes.
